TOPIC: SAFETY –YCPARMIA COMMON SERVICES

In addition to the consultation and training provided by YCPARMIA, there are a number of other services offered to our members. They include, but are not limited to:

- Ergonomic inspection: at the request of management, YCPARMIA will inspect the work station of an employee, recommending adjustments and replacement equipment to reduce the physical impact of the worksite on the employee.
- Fit-testing: at the request of management, YCPARMIA will fit test breathing apparatus for designated employees to ensure proper protection from their breathing masks.
- Air quality testing: YCPARMIA, at the request of management, will determine the quantity of fresh air in a designated worksite. The service is limited to ensuring adequate air; we do not have the capability of determining the quality of the air.
- Noise measurements: At the request of management, YCPARMIA can measure the decibel levels present in a worksite.
- Light measurements: YCPARMIA, at the request of management will determine the amount of footcandles in a designated work area.
- Safety Policy Reviews: At the request of management, YCPARMIA can review a member's various safety policies to ensure that they meet current requirements. Additionally, we can create a training matrix to comply with the various policy requirements.
- Premises inspections: YCPARMIA is available to conduct a safety inspection of member premises. It is preferred that this service be conducted under the direction of the entity's Safety Committee, but on occasion risk concerns recognized by YCPARMIA will trigger an independent inspection.
- OSHA Inspections: YCPARMIA will attend OSHA inspections at the request of management with the intent of minimizing our member's exposure to responses and violations.

As stated above, this is a partial list of offered services. At the request of members, YCPARMIA is willing to explore the purchase of additional safety testing equipment to meet their various needs. At the same time, it is acknowledged that certain services will require that the member retain an industrial hygienist for specialized services.
